This technology used small tuned tines that were then amplified and the resulting sound broadcast through large speaker horns. A Schulmerich unit was selected and installed later in 1954 or 1955. Much like a player piano, there was a roll-feed player unit that took rolls of punched reinforced paper that coded the tines to play songs and other selections. The speakers were placed in the belfry. Fast forward to 2008 wherein we found the unit to be beyond reasonable repair and offered it to a specialist in these types of units. After replacing some stripped gears and making some adjustments, he was able to have the system play a few tunes, which he committed to a compact disk (CD) format and sent along to MAPC.
